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For the Parents

Dear Parents,

I feel blessed to have the opportunity to work with your child this quarter. My prayer is that your child's learning will result in their having a closer relationship with God.

Unit I, "Looking at Our Faith," has five lessons from the books of Jude, 2 Corinthians, 1 Peter, Acts, and Mark. In lesson 1, Jude assures believers of God's promise to keep them from falling and to present them without blemish in God's presence. In lesson 2, Paul warns believers to examine themselves to ensure that they are living in the faith. In lesson 3, Peter urges his readers to defend their faith with humility, gentleness, and reverence. In lesson 4, Stephen is used as an example of how believers should be obedient to God during adversity. And in lesson 5, God raised Jesus from the dead and unlocked the door to Resurrection faith.

Unit II, "How Much Faith Do You Have?" has four lessons from the books of Luke and Matthew. The Scripture passage for lesson 6 cites four men who went through various obstacles to get their sick friend to Jesus for healing. Lesson 7 looks at the amazing faith of a centurion who believed that Jesus only needed to speak and his servant would be healed. Lesson 8 presents the faith of a sinful woman whom Jesus forgave. Lesson 9 identifies a Canaanite woman whom Jesus recognized and blessed for her great faith.

Unit III, "Learning to Stand in Faith," has four lessons from the book of Romans that encourage believers to continue standing in the faith. Lesson 10 indicates that the righteousness of God comes through believers' having faith in Jesus Christ. Lesson 11 provides an example from the life of Abraham. Lesson 12 explores the meaning of being justified by faith, and lesson 13 traces faith that comes from what is heard through the Word of Christ.

You can have a discussion with your child about giving his or her life to God with help from the ABCs of Salvation, listed below.

- A. Say, "Admit you have sinned (see Psalm 32:5), or done wrong." Go through just a few of the Ten Commandments—stealing or lying and so forth. Tell how our sins separate us from God (see Isaiah 59:2 and Romans 3:23).
- B. Say, "Believe Jesus is God's Son. He took the punishment for our sins by dying on the cross (see Romans 5:8). We must believe that Jesus is God's Son and that God raised Him from the dead."
- C. Say, "Call on God to forgive you (see Acts 2:21). When we are sorry for our sins and want to stop doing wrong, we can ask God to forgive us (see Acts 16:31)."




When We Stumble, He Restores Us

Jude reminded the believers of the apostles' teaching. The apostles taught that people would laugh at God and His people in the last days. They would do selfish and sinful things. They would not have the Holy Spirit with them. So, they would do whatever felt good.

They would create trouble and division among God's people.

Jude tells God's people to use their faith to make themselves strong. They should pray under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. They should keep themselves in God's love while they wait for Jesus Christ and His mercy to give them life forever.



Lesson Scripture: Jude 17-25

Key Verses

[Jude wrote,] You, dear friends, . . . keep yourselves in God's love. (Jude 20-21)

They should show *mercy* (kindness) to people who have doubts and make wrong choices. They should save them from falling away from God. But they must be careful not to get influenced by others' sins.

Jude closes the letter by encouraging believers to understand

that God can keep them from falling or choosing wrong. God will bring them before His glory and give them great joy. God deserves the glory, greatness, power, and authority through Jesus Christ, who is Lord for all time—past, now, and forever.


"Yes, Cassandra?" Mr. Sullivan asked.



This week, try your best to deal with the situations in your life with love. Instead of fighting with your brother or sister, try to show love. Your parents will appreciate your efforts.


