WORD POWER!!!

- **Sacred** – Anything relating to our faith, religion, or our church experiences, holy.
- **Salvation** – God’s way of giving us eternal life, being safe and right with God through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross.

GETTING READY!!!

“**A**dvent is a special time of year. It is a little different from Christmas because it is before we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. Each of the four Sundays before Christmas is particularly important for us to understand,” Mrs. Browne said to her church school class. To help the class understand, Mrs. Browne gave each child a word to learn related to Advent. They included words such as hope, sacred, joy, love, faith, disciple, serve, peace, and neighbor. Each student was told to bring back an example of their word and the definition as they understood it. The example had to be something they did or participated in themselves. “Remember,” she said, “next week you will have to tell us exactly what you did and how you define the word you have been given.”

INTO GOD’S WORD!!!

We learned in the last quarter about brokenness, healing, and being changed into wholeness. Now, just as Timothy in our Bible lesson is being taught about salvation and faith from the Apostle Paul, each of you is learning from your teachers and pastor about how to be a better Christian! LESSON SCRIPTURE: Exodus 34:4-7; Psalm 103:1-5, 10-14; Isaiah 40:27-31; Matthew 6:24-34; John 3:3-6; 4:20-24; 8:40-47; Romans 2:2-11; 8:14-17; 1 John 4:7-16

FOCUS SCRIPTURE: Matthew 6:24-34

Key Verse: “Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear.” Matthew 6:25 (NRSV UE)

Matthew 6:24-34 (NRSV UE)

24 “No one can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.

25 Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing?

26 Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?

27 And which of you by worrying can add a single

hour to your span of life?

28 And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin,

29 yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these.

30 But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith?

31 Therefore do not worry, saying, ‘What will we eat?’ or ‘What will we drink?’ or ‘What will we wear?’

32 For it is the gentiles who seek all these things, and

indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things.

33 But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to

you as well.

34 So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today."

- **Care** – Being concerned for something or someone; providing support for an individual in need.

GETTING READY!!!

The letter from the pastor to her congregation during Advent expressed the following: "Christmastime is about giving and receiving gifts for most families that we know. Some families are very blessed and can buy as many gifts as they wish and have more than enough in clothes, food, and money. So, how do we share this kind of wealth and plenty with others? Since we do not have to worry about our resources or what we will have for Christmas, we should show others that we care about them. We can be the ones who allow them to see that God will take care of them. For we all know that being generous with others is a wonderful way to demonstrate love for our neighbor." *What do you think about this pastor's letter? Does it express something that you believe you could do?*

INTO GOD'S WORD!!!

Our **Key Verse** from Matthew today tells us that Jesus will supply our needs and that we should put our trust in him.

Jesus explained to the people who were listening, some of whom may have been in need themselves, not to worry about tomorrow. Jesus already knows what you need! So, rather than worrying about what we may receive for Christmas or what gifts we can have under the tree, why not make a list of those things that we could share with others?

Flash Fun!!!

On a flash card that your teacher will give you, write down at least five items that you would like to have for Christmas. After everyone has completed their cards, put them in a box and allow one person to pull a flash card from the box and write the item on a board from the list. Continue making a list until you have enough items to give to the number of people you have chosen. You may choose a program for less privileged children or youth, or you may find members of your church who are in need! Be sure to list items that you really would have wanted for Christmas to share with someone else.

USING GOD'S WORD!!!

Sharing with others and giving sacrificially is one way to honor God and to share the love that Jesus asks us to have for one another. When we read lessons in the Bible that reveal how God provides and gives instructions to those of us who can do for others, we should take those lessons with us and make them a part of our daily lives. Once your class has gotten the gifts that you would like to give, why not plan a special event at your church or a central location to celebrate? Ask your teacher to assist you in having a special celebration or other gift-giving party. Take the time to get to know those children in your community who desper-

ately need your help! If possible, make it an annual event!

REMIX!!!

Sharing with others, especially those who have less than we do, is pleasing to God. We know from our Bible lessons this week that demonstrating love to one another is what God intends. Because God is love, any love that we show to others is sharing God's message! Remember, we are not to worry about what clothes we will wear, devices we will receive, and what we may or may not get at Christmastime. We should trust God to supply whatever we need. Meanwhile, let's plan to share what we already have with others. That is truly the spirit of Christmas. That is love!

Focus Scripture: Luke 2:11; 15:3-7; Romans 5:6-8

Key Verse: “To you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord.” Luke 2:11 (NRSV UE)

to them, ‘Rejoice with me, for I have found my lost sheep.’

WORD POWER!!!

- **Sheep** – Fragile and innocent animals cared for by a shepherd. In the Bible, sheep are used to explain how we should follow our shepherd, who is Jesus.
- **Emmanuel (ee-man'-u-ell)** – A word in the Old Testament of the Bible; it relates to how God protects us; it means “God is with us.”

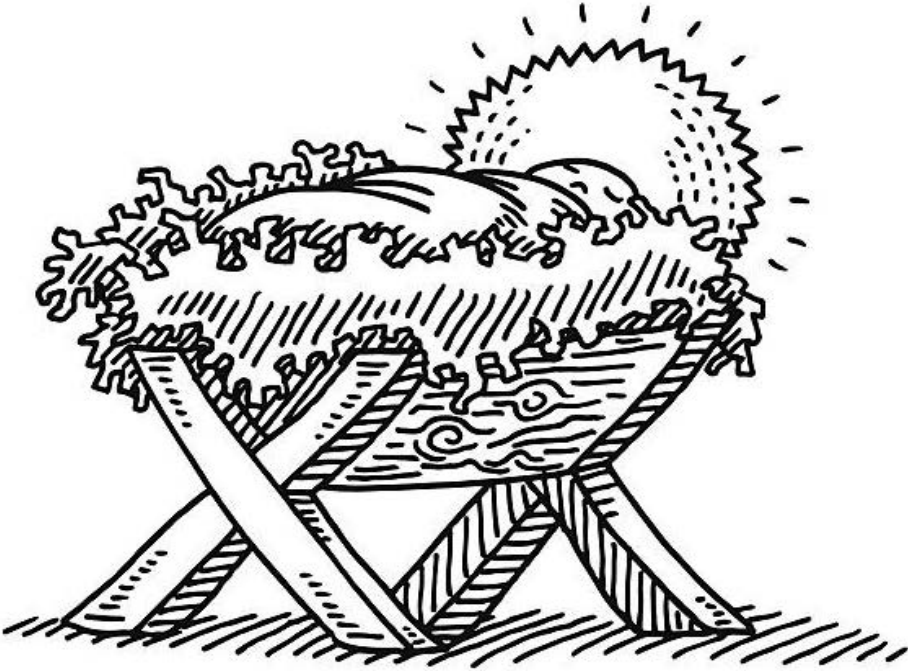
As they pulled up to the house, she looked in her backpack to take out the gift, but it wasn't there. “Oh no! Where is it?”

PRAISE GOD!!!

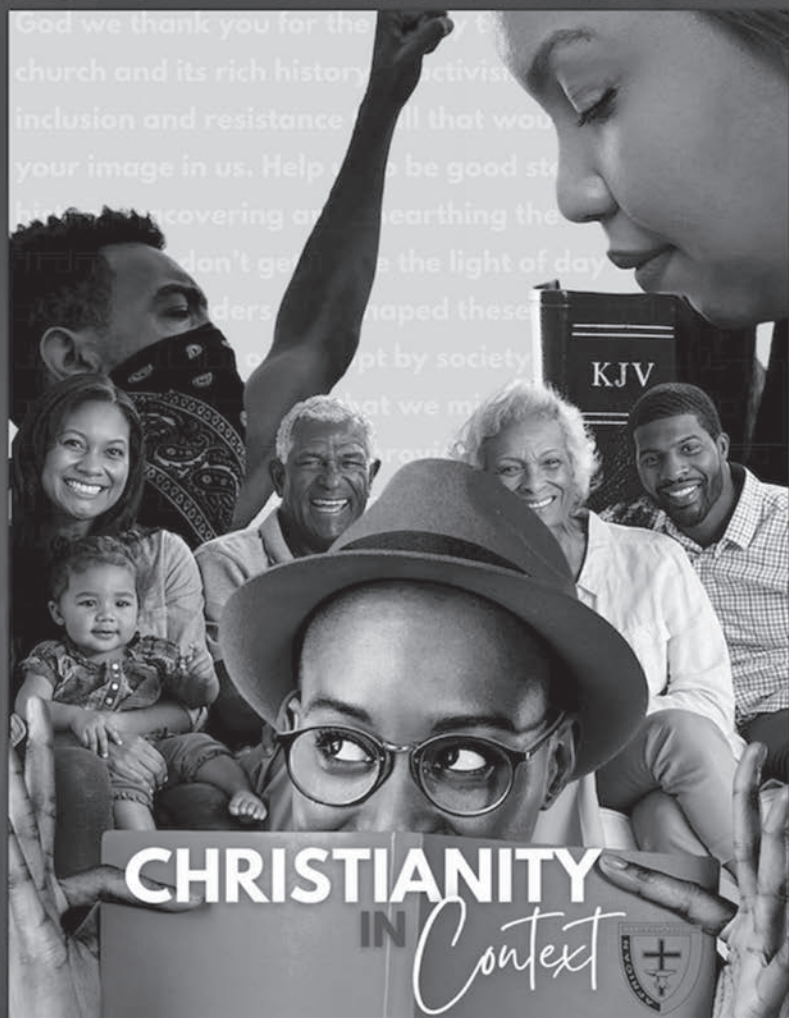
